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


Admiral Nurses West Sussex

Carer's Emergency Alert Card Scheme

The Carer's emergency alert card will identify you as a Carer if you have an accident. If anything happens to you while you're away from the person you care for, those helping you can ring the 24-hour emergency alarm centre number, who will then contact a person/company nominated by yourself to ensure the person you care for is looked after.

This is FREE for anyone living in West Sussex and is run by the Chichester Careline with support from West Sussex County Council.



TuVida (West Sussex)


A not-for-profit organisation providing support to carers and those they care. Different services are available in various locations.
